Important Information About Your Drinking Water

The City of Gladstone collected an insufficient number of water samples in November 2025 and, as a result, did not meet the monitoring and reporting requirements for Microbiological Analysis and Chlorine/Chloramine Residuals.

The City of Gladstone is required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Regular monitoring results help indicate whether our drinking water meets health standards. In November 2025, we did not complete all required microbiological monitoring/testing, nor did we collect or report the required number of chlorine/chloramine residual samples. As a result, we cannot be certain of the quality of our drinking water during that period.

A minimum of one (1) acceptable sample was required to be submitted to a certified laboratory for microbiological analysis, along with the collection and reporting of one (1) chlorine/chloramine residual sample. Records indicate that neither requirement was met in November 2025.

There is nothing you need to do at this time; however, as our customer, you have the right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation.

The City of Gladstone regrets that this error in meeting monitoring requirements occurred. We recognize that a complete monitoring program is essential to ensuring that safe drinking water is provided to all our consumers. Steps have been taken to ensure that adequate monitoring will be performed in the future.

Please share this information with others who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments). You may do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail. The City of Gladstone has posted this notice in the Post Office and at City Hall.
